Constituency Sports Tournaments Background

Constituency Sport Tournaments is a mass participation sport leisure programme established in 2008 by the Botswana Government. The primary reason for introducing the programme was to take youth from the streets by providing them with worthwhile positive activities so that their indulgence in undesirable activities is curtailed if not reduced. The programme targets out of school youth and there is a provision to accommodate a few employed young people up to the age of 40 in various sport codes (i.e. five (5) in football, three (3) in both netball and volleyball). Those who register in the programme should be individuals of teams not affiliated to National Sport Associations. Only three (3) sport codes being football, netball and volleyball currently participate in the programme.

CONSTITUENCY SPORT TOURNAMENT COMPETITIONS PLAY RULES AND REGULATIONS

NETBALL



ARTICLE 1

TITLE

1.1. The Constituency Sport Tournaments shall be played every year on cycles with breaks in between the cycles.

ARTICLE 2

TITLE

2.1. The Constituency Sport Tournaments shall be played on a Tournament basis. Where there are not more than 6 (six) teams in a Council ward, Teams shall play a round robin system and where there are more than 5 [five] teams in a Council Ward, teams will be grouped into pools and winners from each pool will play each other so as to have a champion.

2.2. All games are to be played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the tournament coordinated by various structures established by Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development of respective Districts.

2.3 All games shall be officiated by the appointed competent referees by the Coordinating Committees.

ARTICLE 3

REGISTRATION AND TRANSFERS OF THE PLAYERS

3.1. Each team shall be permitted to register fifteen (15) members of which twelve (12) are players and three (3) are officials/manager for both Netball and volleyball while Football each team shall be permitted to register twenty five (25) members of which twenty-two (22) are players and three (3) are officials/managers.

3.2. The minimum quota required for registration is ten (10) players. Any registration team list with less the number than required shall be NOT be accepted.

3.3. A player shall only play for the team he has registered with, therefore no player shall be permitted to play for more than one team in the same cycle.

3.4. Only unemployed youths shall be permitted to register in the tournaments.

3.4.1. The following shall be allowed to register and participate in the tournament; people working in Ipelegeng programme, Tirelo sechaba, Government volunteer scheme, Internship programme, Herdboys, Farm assistants and House assistant.

- 3.5. Any team which has been found to have violated section 3.4 shall forfeit 3 points 2 goals to the opposing team or for any team they played with in the tournament
- 3.6. All teams are expected to bring approved Registration Lists and certified copies of National Identity Document (Oman) during registration and for inspection before commencement of the game. Any team that fails to comply shall not be permitted to play.
- 3.7. All the registering teams are required to submit completed surety forms comprising of the Team`s Treasurer details.
- 3.8. Certified IDs should be provided for registration. Those with expired IDs will not be permitted to register with the tournament.
- 3.9. Registration of teams will only take place once, in the entire financial year commencing April to March every year, thus no new team will be accepted during the financial year. New participants willing to join the Constituency Sport Tournament are at liberty to join the existing teams. Registration closing date marks the end of movement of players, thus no transfer shall be allowed during the cycle commencement.
- 3.10. Players eligible for participation are those thirty-five (35) years and below.
- 3.11. Constituency Sport Tournaments is illegible to be played by people residing within the constituency by virtue of work, birth, relocation and residing with spouses or relative.
- 3.12. No person or group of people are allowed to manage more than one (1) club. A club may have several sporting codes bearing the same name.

ARTICLE 4

ENTRY QUALIFICATION

- 4.1 Qualification for participation in the Games for Constituency Sport Tournament shall be for teams and players not affiliated and/or registered with the Botswana National Sport Association (BONA). Only teams and players not registered with any team affiliated to the National Sports Associations (BNSC affiliates) shall be eligible to play.
- 4.2. Those players in possession of registration books for clubs affiliated to Botswana National Sport Association (BONA) shall not be permitted to register in the tournament regardless of their playing time at their respective clubs.

4.3. School going girls/boys/women/men from Primary to Tertiary Institutions are

NOT eligible to compete in the tournament.

4.4. In the event of a ward having 1 (one) team in any given sport, the team shall be fixture into the constituency level without getting prize money form the Ward. However, where there are at least 2(two) teams in a ward, they will play home and away against each other with a view to determine the champion.

ARTICLE 5

ORGANISATION OF THE GAMES

5.1 The Organising Committee for the Constituency Sport Tournaments shall Comprise the following: National Coordinating Committee; Regional Committee and Constituency Committee and Council Ward Committee. Where the Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development serve as the Secretariat and as part of the Coordinating structures in all levels of the games. The membership shall be chosen from Community leadership or retired/former players/teams. The membership shall be made of five (5) members who shall elect the Chairperson, Vice- Chairperson, and Vice Secretary.

5.2. The National finals shall be organised by the Local Organising Committee in conjunction with the National Committee.

5.3. The Committees shall assume full responsibility of the management of the finals which shall include fixtures, venues and overseeing the tournament.

5.4. All matters relating to the tournament regarding disputes, misconduct and protests shall be referred to the Appeals Committee for adjudication and resolution.

5.5. Constituency Committee shall be appointed and constituted by members elected by various wards. There shall be an Executive Committee of five (5) people whose responsibility is to settle disputes raised by other teams. Secretary position shall be reserved for MYSC.

5.6. Regional Committee shall be constituted by Chairpersons/Coordinators from various Constituencies. The Secretary position shall lie with MYSC office.

5.7. The members aligned to their own teams should recuse themselves from the hearing to avoid conflict of interest.

5.8. National Coordinating Committee shall constitute of Coordinators from the eight (8) Regions. The membership shall be eight (8) people with one person from Ministry HQ to serve as the Secretary of the Committee.

5.9. National Coordinating Committee Chairperson shall be elected and recommended by the committee members and endorsed by the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Youth empowerment, Sport & Culture Development.

ARTICLE 6

QUALIFICATION TO THE NEXT LEVEL

- 6.1. The Constituency Games shall be played on a round robin basis.
- 6.2. Champions of all levels will qualify to the next level of the Constituency Sport Tournaments.
- 6.3. The game shall consist of four (4) quarters of fifteen (15) minutes each, with intervals of 3 minutes between first-second and third-fourth quarters. Teams shall change at the end of each quarter.
 - 6.3.1. The half time interval shall be either five (5) minutes or ten (10) minutes. The games committees have the powers to decide on time prior to start of the game.
 - 6.3.2. During hot conditions when any one of team plays more than one game, the teams shall be allowed to have an interval of 5 minutes between quarters to allow for enough water break.
 - 6.3.3. This intervals shall be extended to both the Umpires
- 6.4. In the event that two teams have an equal number of goals for and against, and points at the end of the competition, the two teams shall go play penalties.
- 6.5. If after all the above a tie still persists, each team will be given two (2) penalties from a selected spot by the umpires. This will be repeated until a tie is broken.
- 6.6. During the extra time other normal games procedures shall be followed or apply such as substitutions for injuries or illness

ARTICLE 7

SUBSTITUTIONS AND PENALTIES

- 7.1. The teams have the right to make substitutions when they wish to do so.
- 7.2. The substitution can be made either during an interval or when play is stopped for an injury or illness
- 7.3. There is no limitation in the number of substitutes required per team provided the number does not exceed the required maximum registration quota

7.4. During the game, an Umpire may award penalties such as free pass, penalty pass, toss-up, throw in for infringements, rough or dangerous play or when the ball goes out of the court. The following are some of the decisions the referee can make.

7.4.1. Warn a player or team official

7.4.2. Suspend a play for a specific period of time

7.4.3. Order a player to leave the Court and take no further part in the match

7.4.4. After several warnings, expel team official/coach for inappropriate manner uttered

ARTICLE 8

LATE ARRIVALS

Late arrival is not condoned in these organized games.

8.1. A player who arrives after a game has started shall not be permitted to replace a player who has filled that position unless in the occurrence of an injury or illness. In addition to this, the player may be used as a substitution in accordance with Article 8.

8.2. Consequently if the player has not yet filled the position of the late arrival player, the player who arrives late may not enter the game if it's in progression. The process must only take place after notifying the timekeeper and umpire.

8.3. The player must play in the position left vacant and this can only take place after the play has been stopped for injury, illness or after a goal has been scored.

ARTICLE 9

GENERAL MISCONDUCT OR INDISCIPLINE

9.1. Breaking the Play Rules and Regulations, deliberate delay of play or any conduct which is contrary to the spirit of this social game shall constitute a punishable offence

9.2. One (1) cycle shall be imposed upon any team if found guilty of misconduct by the Coordinating Committee or the Appeals Committee.

9.3. Teams which vandalize the school property where they have been accommodated

will be liable to pay for the damage caused and untidy premises. Such payments will be deducted from their prize money

9.4. Use of abusive language, violent behavior or consumption of alcohol by spectators shall constitute disqualification from the competition.

ARTICLE 10

WITHDRAWAL AND PENALTY FOR FAILING TO HONOR GAMES

10.1. All teams that are qualified to play in the Constituency Sport Tournaments games are obliged to play all their competition matches.

10.2. A team that withdraws from the Constituency Sport Tournaments games shall not be replaced once the competition has commenced. If a team withdraws from the competition once it has started, the Council Ward, constituency, Regional and/or National Committee shall determine a way of dealing with the withdrawal without disadvantaging any team, thus all the points of withdrawn teams shall be discarded and log shall be constituted from the remaining teams and the games they have played against each other.

10.3. If a team does not report for a match, except in cases of force majeure and/or Coordinating Committee, or if it refuses to continue to play or leaves the ground before the end of the match, the team shall be considered as having lost and shall not proceed with the Competition. The other team shall be declared winners of the match and awarded three points and two (2) goals.

10.4. The coordinating committee at each level shall take whatever action it deems necessary in cases of force majeure

10.5. A team that gained soft points from a team that failed to honor the match shall NOT proceed to the next stage of competition with soft/free points in case it leads the log. Such teams will be eligible for a replay match with the next team below in the log to determine the winner. This article will not be applicable for teams that play the champion or deciding game, i.e. team that fail to honor the game for championship will be considered to have lost and the opposing team shall progress to the next level.

10.6. Matters of violence and any other disciplinary matter relating to the Games and considered relevant by the Coordinating Committee, shall be referred to the Disputes Resolutions Committees

ARTICLE 11

PROTESTS

- 11.1 In the interest of the tournament and fair play, the Coordinating Committee at each level shall be empowered to adjudicate over the case where evidence is clear that one team has contravened the CST Play Rules and Regulations, even though no team has lodged a protest to that effect.
- 11.2. Protest shall be lodged at the beginning of the match, during the match and before the end of the game shall be registered with the Match officials or Coordinating Committee. Any team which makes verbal protest without proper follow-up through the letter shall deem to have lost the protest.
- 11.3. The protest shall be made in writing and submitted to the Secretary of the Coordinating Committee for adjudication.
- 11.4. The protesting team shall notify the opposing team with a letter of protest. Failure to follow the procedure shall constitute to dismissal of the protest.
- 11.5. In the event that a team uses a defaulter, a penalty of suspension from the cycle shall apply for such a player and 3 points and 2 goals shall be forfeited by the guilty team.
- 11.6. All appeals should be submitted in writing within three (3) working days after the game and it must be indicated in the match sheet. The appeal should be accompanied by adequate evidence. The team that is appealing is responsible for searching for evidence.
- 11.7. The same evidence of documents submitted at the lower structures for determining the matter, shall be submitted to upper structures when appealing.
- 11.8. No protests shall be permitted based on the points or arguing against the decision of the referee. Such matters will be reviewed and determined by the Coordinating Committee.

ARTICLE 12

FORGERY OF EVIDENCE- DOCUMENTS

- 12.1. If the appellant is found to have altered the evidence, such teams will be expelled from the tournament and handed to the investigating authority for necessary action and their names will be shared with the Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development (MYSC) offices.

ARTICLE 13

MATCHES PLAYED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME

- 13.1. All matches shall be played in accordance with the laws of the game governing the tournament.
- 13.2. All teams participating in these games are requested to observe and abide strictly by these Regulations.
- 13.3. A game shall be started by tossing of a coin to determine sides from which will be changed at half time as per the tournament Rules and Regulations.
- 13.4. In all matters that are not covered by these Rules and Regulations the National Coordinating Committees shall make a final decision as it is the case with International Standards.

ARTICLE 14

TEAM COLOURS

- 14.1. In the event of a clash of colours at any game, the host team shall change to an alternative colour. The host team shall be the team appearing first on the fixture schedule. The host team shall be expected to have brought with them to the ground an alternative playing outfit, provided that the change of kit shall not take more than fifteen (30) minutes from the time the Referee orders it.
- 14.2. In the event that there is a delay beyond thirty (30) minutes, on account of clash of colours, the host team shall be held responsible for the delay and shall accordingly be sanctioned by the Coordinating Committee.
- 14.3. In case of delay before the start of the game due to unforeseen circumstances, communication shall be done two (2) hours prior to the game.

ARTICLE 15

REFEREES AND ASSISTANT REFEREES

- 15.1 Referees and Assistant Referees shall be appointed by the Coordinating Committee for purposes of the Constituency Sport Tournament Games.

15.2. In the event the Referees and Assistant referees do not show up at Games, the teams involved may appoint officials at their discretion.

15.3. Teams are encouraged to look for competent impartial referees.

ARTICLE 16

CEREMONIES

16.1 Competing teams at the national finals shall be expected to conform to the proper sport attire and etiquette of awards which will be organized at the end of the games.

ARTICLE 17

SAFETY AND SECURITY

17.1 The national committee and local organizing, constituency and regional committees shall ensure that adequate security personnel is provided at all matches and lodging facilities for the safety of participants and their property as well as the unruly behavior from spectators

ARTICLE 18

OTHER MATTERS

18.1 Teams are reminded that assistance with transport might ONLY be provided at Regional and National Final Championships.

NOTE: No team/individual/committee shall modify/use/develop its own set of rules other than the ones captured on this edition.

ARTICLE 20

STRUCTURE OF COMMITTEES TO RUN

1. NATIONAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE

1.1 Members of the National Coordinating Committee are composed of Chair persons of respective Regions.

1.2 The Chairperson of the National Coordinating Committee is appointed by management of Ministry of Youth Empowerment Sport and Culture Development.

1.3 The Secretariat of the National Coordinating Committee is the Sport Desk at MYSC Headquarters.

- Mobilize participants to register and participate in the programme with MYSC office.
- Oversee games with the assistance of office at ward, constituency and Regional levels.
- Address team managers on any issues relating to the tournament which has been approved by the MYSC office.
- Draft fixtures with team managers and submit to constituency committee and office for approval.
- Appoint and fixture referees and match commissioners for various games.
- Appointment should be approved by whole committee and MYSC office.
- Develop entire schedule for tournament at ward. Constituency and regional level.

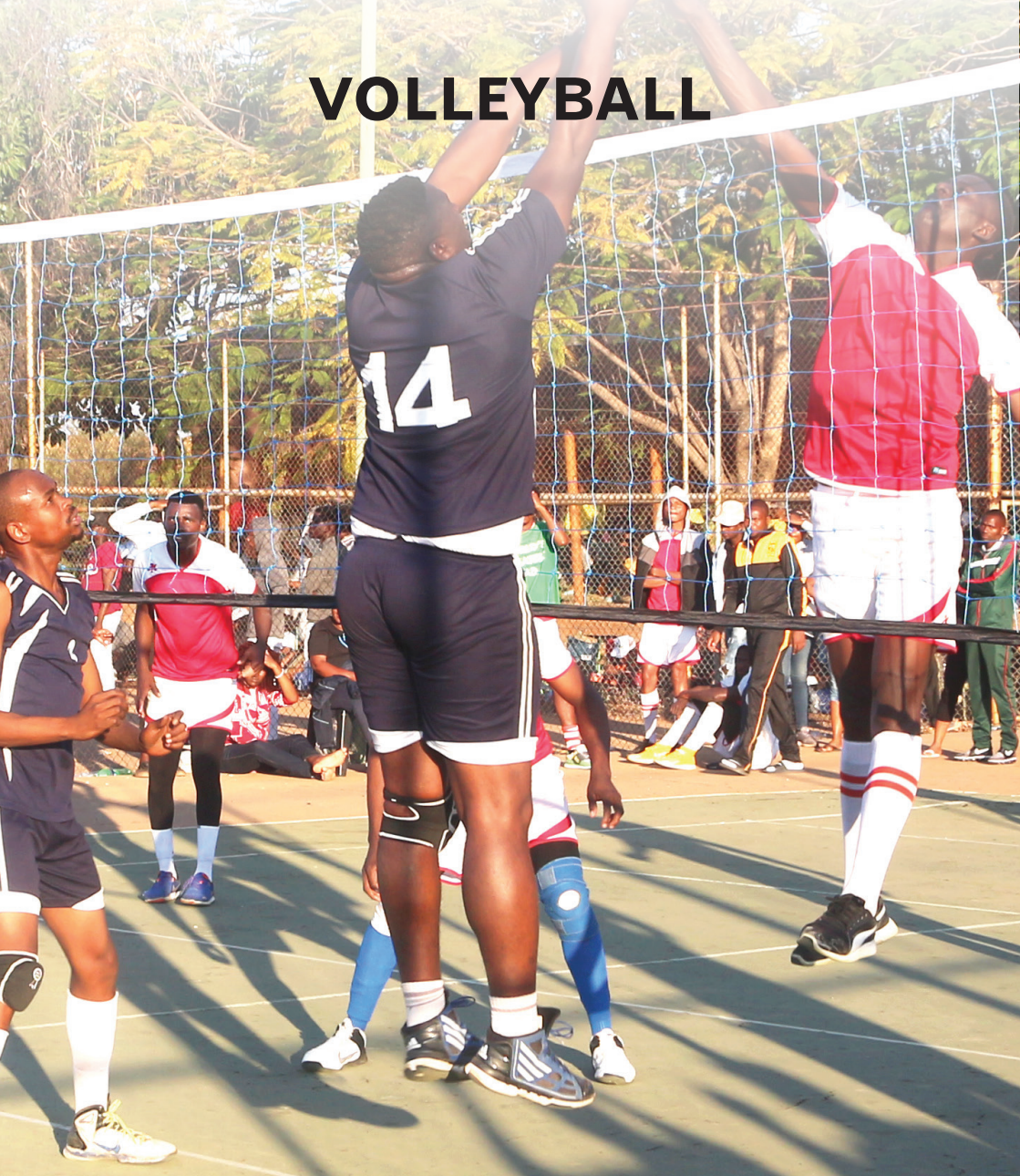
- Compile reports with the presence of team managers and submit to constituency exco for consolidation and submission to office
- Prepare grounds for the competitions.
- Provide necessary support to the Ministry in terms of reviewing rules and regulations for the betterment of the programme.
- Be abreast with the language and interpretation of the rules and regulations.
- Elect the membership of the Regional Committee on a two year period.
- Compile activity reports at the end of the cycle or tournament including those players that joined mainstream leagues.
- Elect an independent committee from the same membership to form a jury or board responsible for dispute resolutions. The elected members should be the ones not serving as Regional Committee.
- Perform any other duty deemed as necessary by the MYSC office.

VOLLEYBALL



ARTICLE 1 TITLE

- 1.1. The Constituency Volleyball Tournaments shall be played every year on a three (3) months cycle with a one month break in between the cycles where possible.

ARTICLE 2 LAWS OF GAMES

- 2.1. The Constituency Volleyball Tournaments shall be played on a Tournament basis. Where there are not more than 6 (six) teams in a Council ward, teams shall play a round robin system and where there are more than 5 [five] teams in a Council Ward, teams will be grouped into pools and winners from each pool will play each other so as to have a champion.
- 2.2. All games are to be played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the tournament coordinated by various structures established by Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture in the Districts
- 2.3 All games shall be officiated by the appointed competent referees by the Coordinating Committees .

ARTICLE 3 REGISTRATION AND TRANSFERS OF THE PLAYERS

- 3.1. Each team shall be permitted to register fifteen (15) players of which twelve (12) are players and three (3) are officials.
- 3.2. The minimum quota required for registration is ten (10) players. Any registration team list with less the number than required shall be NOT accepted.
- 3.3. A player shall only play for the team he has registered with, thus no player shall be permitted to play for more than one team in the same cycle.
- 3.4. Only unemployed Youth shall be permitted to register.
\
 - 3.4.1. According to Employment Act 14 Dec 1994, Chapter 47:01:
"An employee shall refer to any person who has either, before or after the commencement of the Act entered into a contract of employment for the

higher of his/her labour" for instance people working in the farms or house assistants are employees.

- 3.4.2. For registration and participation in the tournament as per above section, shall be given to people working in Ipelegeng Programme, Tirelo Sechaba, Government Volunteer Scheme, Intenship Programme, Herdboys, Farm Assistants and House Assistants
- 3.5. Any team which has been found to have violated section 3.4 shall forfeit the match by score of 3 –0 and 25 – 0 for each set to the opposing team or for any team they played with in the tournament
- 3.6. All teams are expected to bring approved Registration Lists and certified copies of National Identity Document (Omang) during registration and for inspection before commencement of the game. Any team that fails to comply shall not be permitted to play.
- 3.7. All the registering teams are required to submit completed surety forms comprising of the Team`s Treasurer details.
- 3.8. Certified IDs should be provided for registration. Those with expired IDs will not be permitted to register with the tournament.
- 3.9. Registration of teams will only take place once, in the entire financial year commencing April to March every year, thus no new team will be accepted during the financial year. New participants willing to join the Constituency Sport Tournament are at liberty to join the existing teams. The registration forms should collected from Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport & Culture District offices
- 3.10. Movement of players shall only be permitted during registration period. No transfer of players shall be allowed during a Tournament cycle.Registration closing date marks the end of move ment of players, thus no transfer shall be allowed during the cycle commencement.
- 3.11. Players eligible for participation are those thirty (35) years and below.
- 3.12. Constituency Sport Tournaments open to be played by people residing within the constituency by virtue of work, birth, relocation and residing with spouses or relatives

- 3.13. Employed players are not allowed to form their own teams, instead former players and community leaders are permitted to guide the youth teams in relation to coaching and financial advice.
- 3.14. No person or group of people are allowed to manage more than one (1) club(s). A club may have several sporting codes bearing the same name.
- 5.2. The National finals shall be organised by the Local Organising Committee in conjunction with the National Committee.
- 5.3. The Committees shall assume full responsibility of the management of the finals which shall include fixtures, venues and overseeing the tournament.
- 5.4. All matters relating to the tournament regarding disputes, misconduct and protests shall be referred to the Appeals Committee for adjudication and resolution.

ARTICLE 6

QUALIFICATION TO THE NEXT LEVEL

- 6.1. The Constituency Games shall be played on a round robin point system.
- 6.2. Each game shall be played at best of five (5) sets.
- 6.3. The teams shall be divided into two (2) pools where there are more than six (6) teams in a ward. The winning team in the pool shall play the other team in another pool to determine the champion for the ward, constituency and regional levels.
- 6.4. The National Finals shall also be played into two (2) pools, with a round robin system.

ARTICLE 7

CLASSIFICATION OF TEAMS AFTER GAMES PLAYED

- 7.1. By the number of points gained among teams of the same pool, the following points will be gained by each team:
- Victory 3 - 0 or 3 -1 3 points
 - Victory 3 - 2 2 points
 - Defeat 3 – 2 1 point
 - Defeat 3 - 0 or 3 -1 0 point
- 7.2. In the case of a tie, the following shall apply:

- 7.2.1. Number of Victories – In case of equality of match points gained by two or several teams, they will be classified in descending order by the number of matches won.
- 7.2.2. Set quotient – In the case of equality in the number of matches won gained by two or several teams, they will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of the number of all sets won by the number of all sets lost.
- 7.2.3. Points quotient – If the tie persists as per the set quotient (7.2.2) the teams will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of all points scored by the total of points lost during all sets.
- 7.2.4. If the tie continues as per the point quotient (7.2.3) Between two teams, the priority will be given to the team which won the last match between the two concerned teams.
- 7.2.5. When the tie in point quotient is between three or more teams, a new classification of these teams in the terms of 7.2.1 and 7.2.3 will be made taking into consideration only the matches in which they were opposed to each other.
- 7.3. In circumstances where the game fail to be completed within day light due to darkness or ainfall, such game shall be rescheduled to a date & time determined by the Organising Committee. The rescheduled game shall be freshly started.
- 7.4. In the event that there is a delay beyond fifteen (15) minutes before game start, on account of clash of colours, late arrival without satisfactory explanation, the host team shall be held responsible for the delay and shall accordingly be sanctioned by the Council, Ward, Constituency and/or Coordinating Committee. Such sanction may be forfeiture of points.
- 7.5. Any team that consistently and deliberately fails to honour or complete the games for various levels without valid or satisfactory explanation shall be declared to have withdrawn from the tournament, forfeit all points gained in the matches and shall not be eligible for any prize money. The persistent offenders shall be seriously dealt with.

ARTICLE 8

GENERAL MISCONDUCT

- 8.1. Teams shall be held responsible for the misconduct of their members / supporters during these competitions. Suspension and/or disqualification of one (1) cycle shall be imposed upon any team if found guilty of misconduct by the Coordinating Committee. For example Use of abusive language, violent behaviour or consumption of alcohol by spectators shall constitute disqualification from the competition.
- 8.2. Teams which vandalize the school property where they have been accommodated will be liable to pay for the damage caused and untidy premises. Such payments will be deducted from their prize money.

ARTICLE 9

FORMATION OF STRUCTURES

- 9.1. A Council Ward Committee shall be appointed by respective teams registered in that particular ward. The membership shall be chosen from Community leadership or retired/former players, Teachers, Police Officers, and Government Employees having no interest in either team
- 9.2. Constituency Committee shall be appointed and constituted by members elected by various wards.
- 9.3. Regional Committee shall be constituted by Chairmen/Coordinators from various Constituencies
- 9.4. National Coordinating Committee shall constitute of Coordinators from the eight (8) Regions. The membership shall be eight (8) people with one person from Ministry HQ to serve as the Secretary of the Committee.
- 9.5. National Coordinating Committee Chairperson shall be recommended and endorsed by the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport & Culture.

ARTICLE 10

DISPUTES RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEES

- 10.1. A majority decision of the Council Ward Organising Committee on all matters relating to the Constituency Tournaments Games shall be final,

provided that a decision by this Committee may be reviewed by the Constituency Committee.

10.2. A majority of the Constituency Committee on all matters relating to the Constituency Tournament Games shall be final, provided that a decision by this Committee may be reviewed by the Regional Committee.

10.3. Majority of the Regional Committee on all matters relating to the Constituency tournament games shall be final, provided that a decision by this committee may be reviewed by the Constituency Sport Tournament Appeals Committee (CSTNC) which is the last body to resort to.

ARTICLE 11

WITHDRAWAL AND PENALTY FOR FAILING TO HONOR GAMES

11.1. All teams that are qualified to play in the Constituency Tournaments games are obliged to play all their competition matches.

11.2. A team that withdraws from the Constituency Tournaments games shall not be replaced once the competition has commenced. If a team withdraws from the competition once it has started, the Council Ward, Constituency, Regional and/or National Committee shall determine a way of dealing with the withdrawal without disadvantaging any team, thus all the points of withdrawn teams shall be discarded and log shall be constituted from the remaining teams and the games they have played against each other

11.3. If a team does not report for a match, except in cases of force majeure recognized by the Council Ward, Constituency, Regional and/or Coordinating Committee, or if it refuses to continue to play or leaves the ground before the end of the match, the team shall be considered as having lost and shall not proceed with the Competition. The other team shall be declared winner of the match and awarded three points

11.4. The coordinating committee at each level shall take whatever action it deems necessary in cases of force majeure

11.5. A team that gained soft points from a team that failed to honor the match Second referee and then authorized by the 1 referee.

- 12.4. The request substitution must be recorded in the score sheet by the Scorer.
- 12.5. If the team wishes to make simultaneous substitutions, all the players must enter the substitution zone and follow the procedure for section 12.3 and
- 12.6. Maximum of two timeouts per set should be allowed, the timeouts should last 30 seconds
- 12.7. Prolonged, illegal substitution or deliberate delay substitutions or inappropriate requests and actions shall constitute to a warning and continuation of such manner shall result in a loss of a point
- 12.8. Awarding of two consecutive yellow cards shall result in a loss of point
- 12.9. Frequent protest against the decision of the referee shall result in a warning and eventually constitute a yellow card and loss of points if it continues.

ARTICLE 13 PROTESTS

- 13.1. The coordinating committees at each level of the Tournament have the power to Review and deal administratively with any reported irregularities. It is upon the Coordinate Committee to call a team/individual for a hearing.
- 13.2. Protest shall be lodged at the beginning of the match and shall be registered in the scoresheet. Any team which records a protest in the scoresheet and then fail to make proper follow-up through a letter shall be considered to have lost the protest.
- 13.3. The protest shall be formalised in writing and submitted to the Secretary of the Coordinating Committee for adjudication.
- 13.4. The protesting team shall notify the opposing team with a letter of protest. Failure to follow the procedure shall constitute to dismissal of the protest.
- 13.5. In the event that a team uses a defaulter, a penalty of suspension from the cycle shall apply for such a player and the team shall lose the game in which the player was used 3 – 0 (25 – 0 in all the sets).
- 13.6. All appeals should be submitted in writing within three (3) calendar days

after the game and it must be indicated in the match sheet. The appeal should be accompanied by adequate evidence. The team that is appealing is responsible for searching for evidence.

13.7. The same evidence of documents submitted at the lower structures for determining the matter, shall be submitted to upper structures when appealing.

13.8. No protests shall be permitted based on the points or arguing against the decision of the referee. Such matters will be reviewed and determined by the Coordinating Committee.

ARTICLE 14

FORGERY OF EVIDENCE- DOCUMENTS

14.1. If the appealing TEAM or respondent team is found to have altered the evidence, such teams will be expelled from the tournament.

14.2 The case will then be handed to the National constituency tournament committee for necessary action.

ARTICLE 15

MATCHES PLAYED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME

15.1. All matches shall be played in accordance with the laws of the game governing the tournament.

15.2. All teams participating in these games are requested to observe and abide strictly by these Regulations.

15.3. A game shall be started by tossing of a coin to determine team serves first

15.4. In all matters that are not covered by these Rules and Regulations the National Coordinating Committees shall make a final decision.

ARTICLE 16

TEAM COLOURS

- 16.1. In the event of a clash of colours at any game, the host team shall change to an alternative colour. The host team shall be the team appearing first on the fixture schedule.
- 16.2 The host team shall be expected to have brought with them to the ground an alternative playing outfit, provided that more than fifteen (15) minutes from the time the Referee orders it.

ARTICLE 17

REFEREES AND ASSISTANT REFEREES

- 17.1. Referees and Assistant Referees shall be appointed by the Coordinating Committee for purposes of the Constituency Tournaments Games.
- 17.2. In the event the Referees and Assistant referees do not show up at Games, the teams involved may appoint officials at their discretion.
- 17.3. Teams are encouraged to look for competent referees.

ARTICLE 18

CEREMONIES

- 18.1. Competing teams at the National finals shall be expected to confirm to the proper sport attire and etiquette of awards ceremonies which will be organised at the end of the games

ARTICLE 19

SAFETY AND SECURITY

- 19.1. The National Committee and Local Organising, Constituency and Regional Committees shall ensure that adequate security personnel is provided at all matches and lodging facilities for the safety of participants and their property as well as the unruly behaviour from spectators.

ARTICLE 20 OTHER MATTERS

20.1. Teams are reminded that assistance with transport might ONLY be provided at Regional and National Final Championships.

FOOTBALL



ARTICLE 1

TITLE

- 1.1. The Constituency Football Tournaments shall be played every year on a three (3) months cycle with a one month break in between the cycles where possible.

ARTICLE 2

LAWS OF GAMES

- 2.1. The Constituency Football Tournaments shall be played on a Tournament basis. Where there are not more than 6 (six) teams in a Council ward, teams shall play a round robin system and where there are more than 5 [five] teams in a Council Ward, teams will be grouped into pools and winners from each pool will play each other so as to have a champion.
- 2.2. All games are to be played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the tournament coordinated by various structures established by Ministry of Youth, Sport and Culture in the Districts
- 2.3. All games shall be officiated by the appointed competent referees by the Coordinating Committees

ARTICLE 3

REGISTRATION AND TRANSFERS OF THE PLAYERS

- 3.1. Each team shall be permitted to register twenty-five (25) of which twentytwo (22) are players and three (3) are officials/managers.
- 3.2. The minimum quota required for registration is fifteen (15) players. Any registration team list with less the number than required shall be NOT accepted.
- 3.3. A player shall only play for the team he has registered with, thus no player shall be permitted to play or register for more than one team in the same cycle.
- 3.4. Only unemployed Youth shall be permitted to register.
 - 3.4.1. According to Employment Act 14 Dec 1994, Chapter 47:01: "An employee

shall refer to any person who has either, before or after the commencement of the Act entered into a contract of employment for the higher of his/her labour” for instance people working in the farms or house assistants are employees.

- 3.4.2. For registration and participation in the tournament as per above section, shall be given to people working in Ipelegeng Programme, Tirelo Sechaba, Government Volunteer Scheme, Intenship Programme, Herdboys, Farm Assistants and House Assistants
- 3.5. Any team which has been found to have violated section 3.4 shall forfeit 3 points 2 goals to the opposing team or for any team they played with in the tournament. If the player if found to have scored the goals such goals will also be forfeited
- 3.6. All teams are expected to bring approved Registration Lists and certified copies of National Identity Document (Omang) during registration and for inspection before commencement of the game. Any team that fails to comply shall not be permitted to play.
- 3.7. All the registering teams are required to submit completed surety forms comprising of the Team`s Treasurer details.
- 3.8. Certified IDs should be provided for registration. Those with expired IDs will not be permitted to register with the tournament.
- 3.9. Registration of teams will only take place once, in the entire financial year commencing April to March every year, thus no new team will be accepted during the financial year. New participants willing to join the Constituency Sport Tournament are at liberty to join the existing teams.
- 3.12. Movement of players shall only be permitted during registration period. No transfer of players shall be allowed during a Tournament cycle. Registration closing date marks the end of movement of players, thus no transfer shall be allowed during the cycle commencement.
- 3.13. Players eligible for participation are those thirty five (35) years and below.
- 3.14. Constituency Sport Tournaments is illegible to be played by people residing within the constituency by virtue of work, birth, relocation and residing with spouses or relatives
- 3.15. Employed players are not allowed to form their own teams, instead former

players and community leaders are permitted to guide the youth teams in relation to coaching and financial advice. Police, Dikgosi and Councillors shall be Exco-fio members of the Committees in wards and are NOT permitted to form their own teams or affiliate to a single team Botswana Football Association.

- 3.16. No person or group of people are allowed to manage more than one (1) club(s). A club may have several sporting codes bearing the same name.

ARTICLE 4

ENTRY QUALIFICATION

- 4.1 Qualification for participation in the Games for Constituency Tournaments shall be for teams and players not affiliated and/or registered with the Botswana Football Association (BFA). Only teams and players not registered with any team affiliated to the National Sports Associations (BNSC affiliates) shall be eligible to play.
- 4.2. Those players in possession of registration books for clubs affiliated to Botswana Football Association shall not be permitted to register in the tournament regardless of their playing time at their respective clubs. Movement of such players shall take place only within the structures.
- 4.3. School going girls/boys/men/women from Primary to Tertiary institutions are NOT eligible to compete in the tournament.
- 4.4. In the event of a ward having 1 [one] team in any given sport code, the team shall either qualify for the next match stage without the prize money or use the nearest neighbour index to qualify for the next round. However, where there are at least two teams in a ward, they will play against each other with a view to determine a champion.

ARTICLE 5

ORGANISATION OF THE COMPETITION

- 5.1. The Organising Committee for the Constituency Tournaments shall comprise the following: Coordinating Committee; Regional Committee Constituency Committee and Council Ward Committee where the Ministry of Youth, Sport and Culture serves as the Secretariat at Constituency & Regional level as a part of the Coordinating structures in all levels of the games.

- 5.2. The National finals shall be organised by the Local Organising Committee in conjunction with the National Committee
- 5.3. The Committees shall assume full responsibility of the management of the finals which shall include fixtures, venues and overseeing the tournament.

ARTICLE 6

QUALIFICATION TO THE NEXT LEVEL

- 6.1. The Constituency Games shall be played on a round robin point system. Three points shall be awarded for a win, one point for a draw and no points for a loss.
- 6.2. Each game shall be played in the period of forty-five (45) minutes which shall have a break of fifteen (15) minutes and complete the other period of forty-five (45) minutes to make it ninety (90) minutes.
- 6.3. The teams shall be divided into two (2) pools where the winning team in the pool shall play the other team in another pool to determine the champion for the ward, constituency and regional levels.
- 6.4. The games at a ward level shall be played on home and away routine basis to determine the winner of the pool. The championship level shall be played once to determine the winner.
- 6.5. The National Finals shall be played into two (2) pools, with a round robin system in which section 6.3 will also apply.
- 6.6. Three points shall be awarded for a win, onpoint for a draw and zero points for a loss. The team with the highest number of points shall be declared the winner of the pool in all levels.
- 6.6. In the event that two teams have an equal number of points at the end of the game, a better goal difference will determine the winner and if the goals difference is the same, then the team with more goals for, will advance. If after 90 minutes of play, the two teams have equal number of goals, a penalty shoot-out shall be conducted in order to determine the winning team.
- 6.7. In circumstances where the game fail to be completed within stipulated ninety (90) minutes due to darkness or rainfall, such game shall be rescheduled to a date & time determined by the Organising Committee. The rescheduled game shall be freshly started.

- 6.8. In the event that there is a delay beyond fifteen (15) minutes of kick off, on account of clash of colours, late arrives without satisfactory explanation, the host team shall be held responsible for the delay and shall accordingly be sanctioned by the Council Ward, Constituency and/or Coordinating Committee. Such sanction may be forfeiture of points.
- 6.9. Any team that consistently and deliberately fails to honor or complete the games for various levels without valid or satisfactory explanation shall be declared to have withdrawn from the tournament, forfeit all points gained in the matches and shall not be eligible for any prize money. The persistent offenders shall be seriously dealt with.

ARTICLE 7

- 9.2. A majority of the Constituency Committee on all matters relating to the Constituency Tournament Games shall be final, provided that a decision by this Committee may be reviewed by the Regional Committee. The Secretary position shall lie with MYSC office.
- 9.3. All matters relating to the tournament regarding disputes, misconduct and protests shall be referred to the Appeals Committee for adjudication and resolution.
- 9.4. The members aligned to their own teams should recuse themselves from the hearings to avoid conflicts interests.
- 9.5. Majority of the Regional Committee on all matters relating to the constituency tournament games shall be final, provided that a decision by this committee may be reviewed by the Constituency Sport Tournament Appeals Committee (CSTNC) which is the last resort body.

ARTICLE 10

WITHDRAWAL AND PENALTY FOR FAILING TO HONOR GAMES

- 10.1. All teams that are qualified to play in the Constituency Tournaments games are obliged to play all their competition matches.
- 10.2. A team that withdraws from the Constituency Tournaments games shall not be replaced once the competition has commenced. If a team withdraws

from the competition once it has started, the Council Ward, Constituency, Regional and/or National Committee shall determine a way of dealing with the withdrawal without disadvantaging any team, thus all the points of withdrawn teams shall be discarded and log shall be constituted from the remaining teams and the games they have played against each other.

- 10.3. If a team does not report for a match, except in cases of force majeure recognised by the Council Ward, Constituency, Regional and/or Coordinating Committee, or if it refuses to continue to play or leaves the ground before the end of the match, the team shall be considered as having lost and shall not proceed with the Competition. The other team shall be declared winners of the match and awarded three points and two (2) goals.

- 10.5. A team that gained soft points from a team that failed to honor the match shall NOT proceed to the next stage of competition with soft/free points in case it leads the log. Such teams will be eligible for a replay match with the next team below in the log to determine the winner. This article will not be applicable for teams that play the champion or deciding game, i.e. team that fail to honor the game for championship will be considered to have lost and the opposing team shall progress to the next level.
- 10.6. Matters of violence and any other disciplinary matter relating to the Games and considered relevant by the Coordinating Committee, shall be referred to the Disputes Resolutions Committees.

ARTICLE 11

SUBSTITUTIONS AND AWARDING OF CARDS

- 11.1. Only 3 players shall be substituted per an organised game.
- 11.2. If a player is given two (2) consecutive yellow cards in two different games and if a player or coach is red carded, he/she shall miss the next game.
- 11.3. Serious fouls committed by players shall lead to suspension of two games.

ARTICLE 12

PROTESTS

- 12.1. The coordinating committees at each level of the Tournament have the power to review and deal administratively with any reported irregularities. It is upon the coordinate Committee to call a team/individual for a hearing.
- 12.2. Protest shall be lodged at the beginning of the match and shall be registered with the Match officials or Coordinating Committee. Any team which make verbal protest without proper follow-up through the letter shall be considered to have lost the protest.
- 12.3. The protest shall be made in writing and submitted to the Secretary of the Coordinating Committee for adjudication.
- 12.4. The protesting team shall notify the opposing team with a letter of protest. Failure to follow the procedure shall constitute to dismissal of the protest.
- 12.5. In the event that a team uses a defaulter, a penalty of suspension from the cycle shall apply for such a player and 3 points and 2 goals shall be forfeited by the guilty team.
- 12.6. All appeals should be submitted in writing within three (3) working days after the game and it must be indicated in the match sheet. The appeal should be accompanied by adequate evidence. The team that is appealing is responsible for searching for evidence.
- 12.7. The same evidence of documents submitted at the lower structures for determining the matter, shall be submitted to upper structures when appealing.
- 12.8. No protests shall be permitted based on the points or arguing against the decision of the referee. Such matters will be reviewed and determined by the Coordinating Committee.

ARTICLE 13

FORGERY OF EVIDENCE- DOCUMENTS

- 13.1. If the appealing is found to have altered the evidence, such teams will be expelled from the tournament and handed to the investigating authority for necessary action.

ARTICLE 14

MATCHES PLAYED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME

- 14.1. All matches shall be played in accordance with the laws of the game governing the tournament.
- 14.2. All teams participating in these games are requested to observe and abide strictly by these Regulations.
- 14.3. A game shall be started by tossing of a coin to determine sides from which will be changed at half time as the tournament Rules and Regulations.
- 14.4. In all matters that are not covered by these Rules and Regulations the National Coordinating Committees shall make a final decision as it is the case with International Standards.

ARTICLE 15

TEAM COLOURS

- 15.1. In the event of a clash of colours at any game, the host team shall change to an alternative colour. The host team shall be the team appearing first on the fixture schedule. The host team shall be expected to have brought with them to the ground an alternative playing outfit, provided that the change of kit shall not take more than fifteen (15) minutes from the time the Referee orders it.

ARTICLE 16

REFEREES AND ASSISTANT REFEREES

- 16.1. Referees and Assistant Referees shall be appointed by the Coordinating Committee for purposes of the Constituency Tournament Games.
- 16.2. In the event the Referees and Assistant referees do not show up at Games, the teams involved may appoint officials at their discretion.
- 16.3. Teams are encouraged to look for competent referees.

ARTICLE 17

CEREMONIES

17.1. Competing teams at the National finals shall be expected to confirm to the proper sport attire and etiquette of awards ceremonies which will be organised at the end of the games

ARTICLE 18

SAFETY AND SECURITY

18.1. The National Committee and Local Organising, Constituency and Regional Committees shall ensure that adequate security personnel is Provided at all matches and lodging facilities for the safety of participants And their property as well as the unruly behavior from spectators.

ARTICLE 19 OTHER MATTERS

19.1. Teams are reminded that assistance with transport might ONLY be provided at Regional and National Final Championships.

ATHLETICS



ARTICLE 1

TITLE

- 1.1. The Constituency Athletics Competitions shall take place every financial year on a two (2) cycle with some break between the 2 cycles
- 1.2. Constituency Athletics Competition shall be governed on a heat-final basis starting at Sub District level in sprints, medium races and middle to longdistances.
- 1.3. Competitions are to be held in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the competition here contained, coordinated by various Committees established by Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development at Districts and Sub Districts.
- 1.4. Competitions shall be officiated by qualified/competent technical officials appointed by the Coordinating Committees with the guidance of the Botswana Athletics Association.

ARTICLE 2

ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. An athlete or team is eligible to compete in the competitions when he/she is registered with Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development at respective districts and Sub District.
- 2.2. No athlete or team will enter the competitions without the consent of the registering body.
- 2.3. Competitions Organisers reserve the right to seek for proof or eligibility in instances where they doubt the registration form.
- 2.4. The registration form must be complete even indicating in the part on the athlete fitness to participate.
- 2.5. Certified copies of Omang, and/or passport documents will permit the athlete to register and to compete.

- 2.6. Registration is for those athletes with 30 years and below
- 2.7. No foreign National will be permitted to register to participate unless if she/he has naturalised
- 2.8. No employees are allowed to register and participate, other than Ipelegeng, Tirelo Sechaba, Herdboys, House Assistants, Farm Assistants, Government Volunteer Scheme and those in Internship Programme.

ARTICLE 3

REGISTRATION

- 3.1. An athlete or teams are expected to bring approved Registration Lists and certified copies of National Identity Document (Oman) during registration and for inspection before commencement of the competition. Any club or individual that fails to comply shall not be permitted to compete.
- 3.2. Certified IDs should be three (3) months or less, any certified copy of ID which is more than three (3) months old will not be accepted. Those with expired IDs will not be permitted to register with the tournament.
- 3.3. Registration of Athletes or teams will only take place once, in the entire financial year commencing April to March every financial year. New participants will be allowed to register. Athletes are allowed to change categories after a cycle.
- 3.4. Registration must take place in the respective constituencies/District/Sub District where the competitions are held.
- 3.5. No athlete is allowed to register more than (2) events unless the third (3rd) event is a relay.
- 3.6. The District offices will issue the athletes with registration forms and keep a data of how athletes and teams have registered in the constituency/ District/ Sub District.
- 3.7. Where an athlete changes the District or Constituency during the calendar of the competitions, they may seek for transfer to another Constituency/District from relevant authorities. The athlete however must complete his/her competitions representing the same Constituency he registered for.

- 3.8. Athletes or teams will only be allowed to compete in the competitions when they have registered within one constituency.
- 3.9. Athletes eligible for participation are those thirty (30) years and below.
- 3.10. Constituency Athletics Competitions is illegible for those residing within the constituency by virtue of work, birth, relocation and residing with spouses or relatives
- 3.11. Registration forms should be collected from MYSC Districts/Sub District offices.

Kgotla/District Commissioner Office and BNSC offices. Registration period shall be announced and any athlete or team that submit the registration forms at designated places after deadline shall be rejected.

ARTICLE 4

ENTRY QUALIFICATION

- 4.1. Qualification for participation in the Constituency Athletics Competitions shall be for teams and athletes not affiliated and/or registered with the Botswana Athletics Association (BAA). Only teams and athletes who have not competed in the last eighteen months (18) of Botswana Athletics Associations events (BAA affiliates) shall be eligible to compete except with written permission from BAA Secretary General or Sport Development Officer at BAA.
- 4.2. Those athletes in possession of registration books or licenses for clubs affiliated to Botswana Athletics Association or had competed within the BAA organised competition within the last eighteen months shall be permitted to register in the competitions.
- 4.3. School going girls/boys/men/women from Primary to Tertiary institutions are NOT eligible to compete in the tournament. BOCCODOL students are also allowed to participate. The youth awaiting Form 5 results shall register for participation in the coming cycle(s) provided that they completed studies while registration is on-going. Furthermore, the youth that are admitted to different schools after registration are allowed to continue competing till the end of the competition.

4.4. All participants of the competition who registered and are admitted as students are allowed to continue competing till the end of the cycle.

ARTILCE 5

COMPETITION ATTIRE

- 5.1. Athletes taking part in the competitions are expected to put in the proper acceptable attire. No athlete will be allowed to compete with long trousers, tracksuits, jeans, soccer boots, military boots, casual shoes or sandals.
- 5.2. The permitted attire are, running shoes, polyester shorts, bibs, vests.
- 5.3. Athletes or teams my display name of title sponsors on their vest.
- 5.4. Each athlete or team will be issued with a race number during the competitions this will likely take place at the regional level and national finals

ARTICLE 6

CONSTITUENCIES AND REGIONS

- 5.2. The permitted attire are, running shoes, polyester shorts, bibs, vests.
- 5.3. Athletes or teams my display name of title sponsors on their vest.
- 5.4. Each athlete or team will be issued with a race number during the competitions this will likely take place at the regional level

ARTILCE 7

ORGANISATION OF THE COMPETITIONS

- 7.1 The Organising Committee for the Constituency Athletics Competition shall comprise the following:
Sub-district Athletic Coordinating Committee; District Athletic Committee, Regional Athletic Committee and National Athletics Coordination Committee where the Ministry of Youth Empowerment, Sport and Culture Development and Botswana National Sport Commission/BAA shall serves as the Secretariat and Exo-fixio members of all committees where possible.
- 7.2. The National finals shall be organised by the Local Organising Committee in conjunction with the National Competitions Committee
- 7.3. The Committees shall assume full responsibility of the management of the finals which shall include start list, venues and overseeing the competition results with the support of the BAA Regional and National Competition Committee structures.
- 7.4. All matters relating to the tournament regarding disputes, misconduct and protests shall be referred to the Appeals Committee or Competition Manager for adjudication and resolution

ARTICLE 8

FORMATION OF STRUCTURES

- 8.1. Formation of structures or committees responsible for the Constituency Athletics Competition shall comprise of the following
- 8.1.1 Districts and Sub- District Athletic Committee which is responsible for implementation of the competitions at District and Sub District level.
- 8.1.2. Regional Athletics Committee which is made up of members from District Athletic Committee or Sub-District Athletic Committee
- 8.1.3. National Athletic Coordinating Committee which constitute members from Regional Athletic Committee, Botswana Athletic Association and MYSC HQ
- 8.1.4. All the committees shall include a technical manager who shall be

appointed by BAA and MYSC.

8.1.5 All Committees should be as per Athletics guidelines.

ARTICLE 9

QUALIFICATION TO THE NEXT LEVEL

- 9.1. The Constituency Athletics Competitions shall be held on the basis that if more than 8 athletes have registered for the same race, heat-races will be conducted as eliminations for finals
- 9.2. The top three (3) winners of each race will proceed from District level to the Regional level of the constituency competitions.
- 9.3. Position one to six (6) from the Regional Level in each race will qualify for the National level
- 9.4. In all races, BAA Competitions rules will apply.
- 9.5. There can never be a tie as time will be used, but in case there is a perception of a tie, BAA Rules will apply

ARTICLE 10

SUBSTITUTION, CHANGE OF RACES AND PENALTIES

- 10.1. Athletes have the right to change category only at the District level and such can only be made two hours (2 hours) before the start of the competition.
- 10.2. The substitution can also be made for the relays but from the list of registered athletes at that level only.

ARTICLE 11

LATE ARRIVALS

- 11.1. Late arrival is not condoned in these organised competitions.
- 11.2 An athlete who arrives after the final call room shall be disqualified and no replacement is allowed under any condition.

ARTICLE 12

GENERAL MISCONDUCT OR INDISCIPLINE

- 12.1 Breaking the Competition Rules and Regulations, deliberate delay of competition or any conduct which is contrary to the spirit of this social competition shall constitute a punishable offence (disqualification)
- 12.2. Athletes or Clubs shall be held responsible for the misconduct during these competitions. Suspension or disqualification from the competition shall be imposed upon any team/athlete if found guilty of misconduct by the Coordinating Committee or the Appeals Committee.
- 12.3. Teams/athletes who vandalize the property where they have been accommodated will be liable to pay for the damage caused and be expelled from the competitions
- 12.4. Use of abusive language, violent behaviour or consumption of alcohol by athletes shall constitute disqualification from the competition

ARTICLE 13

WITHDRAWAL AND PENALTY FOR FAILING TO HONOR COMPETITIONS

- 13.1. All teams/athletes that qualified to compete in the Constituency Athletics Competitions are obliged to attend competition.
- 13.2. A team/athlete that withdraws from the Constituency Athletic competition shall not be replaced once the competition has commenced. If a team/athlete withdraws from the competition once it has started, the Coordinating Committee shall proceed with the competitions

- 13.3. If a team/athlete does not turn up for a competition, it is regarded as failure to participate and therefore disqualification will be effected for the entire cycle.
- 13.4. The coordinating committee at each level shall take whatever action it deems necessary in cases of force majeure.
- 13.5. Matters of violence and any other disciplinary matter relating to the Competition and considered relevant by the Coordinating Committee, shall be referred to the Competition Manager.

ARTICLE 14

PROTESTS

- 14.1. The coordinating committees at each level of the competition have the power to review and deal administratively with any reported irregularities. It is upon the Coordinating Committee to call a team/individual for a hearing.
- 14.2. Protest shall be lodged two hours (2 hours) before the start of the competition in writing to the Competition Managers or Coordinating Committee. Any team/athlete which make verbal protest without proper follow-up through the letter shall be deemed to have lost the protest.
- 14.3. The protest shall be made in writing, signed by the athlete or official representing the athlete/team and submitted to the Secretary of the Coordinating Committee for adjudication within thirty (30 minutes) of the end of the competition
- 14.4. The protesting team/athlete shall notify the competition manager or coordinating committee with a letter of protest. Failure to follow the procedure shall constitute a dismissal of the protest.
- 14.5. In the event that a team/club uses a defaulter, a penalty of suspension from the competition shall apply for such a team/athlete and shall forfeit all what has been gained from the competition and be liable for expulsion
- 14.7. No protests shall be permitted based on the points or arguing against the decision of the lane judges or judge. Such matters will be reviewed and determined by the Coordinating Committee who shall deal with it on the same day.

ARTICLE 15

FORGERY OF EVIDENCE - DOCUMENTS

15.1. If the athlete/team is found to have altered the evidence, such teams/athlete will be expelled from the competition and handed to the investigating authority for necessary action.

ARTICLE 16

COMPETITION HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME

- 16.1. All Competitions shall be conducted in accordance with these Rules and Regulations the BAA and IAAF Rules.
- 16.2. All teams/athletes participating in these games are requested to observe and abide strictly by these Regulations.
- 16.3. All sprints event shall be started by the following command: On your marks; SET which shall be followed by a firing of a starting pistol
- 16.4. The competition shall first commence at the Sub District/District level, then Regional level and the final stage is the National finals.

ARTICLE 17

COMPETITION MANAGEMENT

- 17.1. Competition management shall be appointed by the Coordinating Committee.
- 17.2. In the event the appointed officials do not show up at Competition one hours (1 hour) after the scheduled time, the teams involved may appoint officials at their discretion and start the competition.

ARTICLE 18

OTHER MATTERS

18.1 Teams are reminded that assistance with transport might ONLY be provided at Regional and National Final.

NOTE: No team/individual/committee shall modify/use/develop its own set of rules other than the ones captured on this edition.

ARTICLE 19

RESPONSIBILITIES

The responsibilities of the Constituency Athletics Committees include amongst others to:

- Mobilise participants to register and participate in the programme.
- Enter data of names of participants in the start list.
- Develop Schedule for competitions at sub-district and District level in agreement with MYSC District Office.
- Make a checklist of the necessary equipment and accessories needed.
- Prepare grounds for the competitions.
- Provide necessary support to the Ministry in terms of reviewing Rules and Regulations for the betterment of the programme.
- Advise on the technical matters of the competitions to MYSC and District Athletic Coordinators.
- Interpret rules and regulations of the competitions.
- Record finish times for all competing athletes and submit to the office to initiate payment
- Compile activity reports at the end of the cycle or competitions.
- Recommend potential athletes to Botswana Athletic Association for further development and consideration in elite level.

Employed personnel serving as Committee members and paid allowances will not be entitled for overtimes.

Below also is the approved payment structure for constituency Athletics Competitions participats for attaining the position 1-3 only.
